
YEAR 1











YEAR 3


YEAR 4

We have also been getting very excited as we plan our next experiment for science to determine how conditions affect the growth of different types of plants, which we will then assess and see what improvements and changes can be made to the set up of the experiment or if another group could be added.

In humanities this week, Year 6 has been looking at the timeline of Moroccan history. They spent time analysing and ordering sources which at first did not contain any dates. They then compiled their sources together and were given key dates to organise them chronologically.
