I hope that you all had an enjoyable and relaxing break. I have enjoyed hearing from the children about what they did and what they enjoyed doing during the two weeks. It is good to see everyone returned safe and ready for the start of the new term.

This week the children have settled well into their classes for the start of Term 3 and I hope that you find the curriculum overviews, sent today, to be useful and informative. Also, we have spent a great deal of time working on our ECA provision for this term, listening to feedback from students and parents, and we hope that your child enjoys their choices of activities over the coming weeks.

EYFS:

Nursery

This week we have been learning about sea creatures. Our story has been the *Rainbow Fish* and we have done various activities based on this. We have learned the names of sea creatures and where they live, how they move and what they look like. We talked about which are our favourites and why. We have made ocean coloured play dough and created scenarios from under the sea and created fishes. We have made Jellyfish using different materials. In science, we have felt the texture of shells and sand using the tuff spot and looked at factual books about whales and we have observed how the sun affects ice and it melts as the temperature changes.

Reception



This week in Reception, we have started to work on our new topic 'All around the world'. It has been a great topic to start this term as the children have been happy to share their recent holiday adventures, whether that be within Morocco or to another country. In both reception classrooms we have set up an airport terminal where the children are able to gain new skills and learn the language needed for travelling. The children are using role play with each other to book holidays and flights by looking through

holiday brochures to see where they would like to travel on their next holiday and making their own boarding passes.

YEAR 1

This week in Year 1, it has been lovely to see everyone back at school safe and well after some exciting holidays. We heard all about everyone's adventures this week and revised our writing skills to write recounts of what we did. In maths, it has been a pleasure to observe the children apply their multiplication skills to solve problems involving 2s, 5s and 10s. Thank you for all your support and encouraging your child to use Times Tables Rock Stars and the activities posted on Education City. It is having a great impact. In humanities, we have had lots of fun beginning our new topic about 'the stories people tell' with the myth of King Arthur. In science, we have asked questions about magnets and begun a practical investigation.

YEAR 2

Year 2 has settled back into learning after the half term break. We started this term in maths with learning, identifying and understanding fractions. In English, we enjoyed listening to different rhyming poems and some children even managed to perform a poem!



YEAR 3

During maths, we finished the 'Mass and volume measurement' unit. We went hands-on and used materials from the lab to practise concepts we have covered, such as grams and millilitres. I'm thrilled to see how much our group enjoys practical activities.





YEAR 4




Year 4 has been learning about energy. We learnt that energy is how things work and energy comes in different forms such as light, sound and heat. We went on an energy hunt around the school to find objects that produce energy and talked about what types of energy.

YEAR 5

Year 5 has been learning about fractions in maths. We have been identifying equivalent fractions and working out how to find them. We made some fraction walls in our groups to show equivalent fraction groups and had a race to write down as many as we could.

YEAR 6

In science this week, Year 6 have started their new topic of materials and physical changes. They conducted a few experiments involving paper to test air resistance, and candles to understand the concept of oxygen and combustion. They wrote up predictions and their conclusions and also looked at how different variables affect the tests.
