Finally, I must thank a few key people who have gone above and beyond to support me, especially in the last few months when I was juggling Head of Primary, Phase leader for EYFS and Phase 2, with full-time class teacher and also Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead. Firstly, to Ms Meryeme Alaoui, our Primary co-ordinator, who has taken on more of the admin and organisational roles and also to Mr Seamus Rush, who has been an amazing colleague and support on our Primary Leadership Team. I would also like to thank those parents who have continually provided support, been positive critical friends and shown empathy and kindness over the year.

I wish you and your families best wished for a positive and enjoyable summer holiday and look forward to seeing many of you in September. For those families who are not returning, may I wish you every happiness and success in the future. I hope that you have some fond memories to look back on.
