Nursery

In Nursery as part of our animal topic we have been reading "We're going on a Bear Hunt." The children used musical instruments to make the different sounds for the grass, river, mud, forest snow and cave. Then later in the week using boxes we went on our very own Bear Hunt using our senses to feel the different settings. The children had great fun and used a wide range of vocabulary to describe the experience.



Reception

In reception this week we have continued with our topic 'people who help us'. The children had lots of fun investigating a 'crime scene' in the classroom as mini detectives and enjoyed making fingerprints of their left and right hands. It has been fantastic to see everyone trying hard in phonics this week and some children have begun to write simple sentences using 'ck' and 'e' graphemes in their words. Well done to all in Reception!

YEAR 1

Our little scientists rolled up their sleeves and got their hands dirty planting seeds! They have been learning all about plant parts and what plants need to survive, so it was time to put their green thumbs to the test. Each day, they will record the progress of these germination experiments – giving our plants different conditions and seeing who sprouts first.



YEAR 2

In Year 2, we practised our speaking skills! The children showed lots of enthusiasm and confidence when reciting their poems. Some read and some memorised. It was amazing to see the children encouraging their peers during this time.

We also learned more about People who help us, such as doctors and the children, learned about common illnesses and what the symptoms are and diagnose and treat them. Wonderful work to our little medics!









YEAR 3

This week, year 3 children have been extra scientific by completing a 'Forces' experiment where they investigated friction. Children learnt how to make the investigation a fair test - by keeping the equipment the same and only changing one variable - the surface. They observed, predicted, measured and recorded all of their results.





YEAR 4

This week, Year 4 have studied how, where, and why volcanoes are formed. They have worked in groups to find the key information behind one of Earth's most constructive and destructive features. Their hard work has led to the creation of some very informative posters.

YEAR 5

This week year 5 has been learning all about Ancient Greek daily life from many different perspectives such as men, women, children, soldiers, leaders and slaves. They have braved the cold and taken their learning outside by running around to hunt down some facts to record in their notes for upcoming lessons.





YEAR 6

Year 6 have started their new maths topic of ratio. They have worked hard to compare objects and write sentences while using the new ratio symbol. They have understood that while the amount might change, the ratio can stay the same, linking in their knowledge of equivalent fractions.
