Reception



This week in Reception we have enjoyed beginning our new topic 'Spring'. Thanks to all the wonderful plants the children have brought in our classrooms are full of life! We have enjoyed role play activities linked to spring themed stories and had lots of fun comparing different traditional tales such as 'Aladdin' and 'Jack and the Beanstalk'. In maths we have used cubes to create staircases helping the children to count 'one more' and 'one less'.



YEAR 1

This week in Year 1, we've been exploring our exciting topic on 'Toys'! Some children brought in their toys to explore, and most could identify the materials they're made from, as well as any moving parts. In English, the children learned to use the past tense by adding -ed to words, which helped them write about their fun Spring holiday events. In Maths, the children worked on number bonds to 20, using their knowledge of bonds to 10 to solve problems and build up to 20.



YEAR 2

Today we went to KoJump, as part of our learning about "Forces" in science. We had a great time jumping on the trampolines and seeing how high we could bounce. YEAR 4

Year 4 have started several exciting topics this week. In humanities, we began a human geography topic of 'megacities' this week. In science, we discussed the different biomes that animals and plants call their habitats, and how they are adapted to them. And, most excitingly, in Maths we have tackled our first lessons of the year on fractions.

This week, year 5 have built up their characters through teamwork and challenging themselves on our school trip to art nature. They were incredibly brave, scaling the tops of trees and ziplining from treetop to treetop and overcoming great challenges.
