## **EYFS:**

### **Nursery**

This week our story has been "The Little Red Hen" so we have been doing activities based on this. We have discussed what we would do if we were the characters from the story, would we share or would we help. We have been learning about which ingredients make bread and have made our own bread. We have also looked at the lifecycle of a chicken.

### **Nursery**

This week in Reception we have enjoyed learning all about shape. Looking at 3D shapes in particular. The children have been exploring in the classroom and around the playground looking for different shapes. They have also been able to use their imagination thinking of the outside environment, for example saying that a cone and a semi circle together is like an ice cream cone and a cuboid and a square pyramid looks like a mosque. Great work, Reception!

## YEAR 1

This week, the children returned with great enthusiasm and began by writing descriptive holiday recounts, practising key writing skills in preparation for next week's reading, writing, and maths assessments.

In Humanities, our International Day topic has inspired the children to explore their chosen countries. They've been learning key facts and greetings, and their creativity has shone through in the colourful artwork that now brightens up our classrooms. Well done, Year 1!



## YEAR 2

Welcome back! This week, the children have been learning about famous authors. We also started our work on tally charts. To end the week, we took a trip to the beach to align with our environment topic. The weather was amazing and the children had an excellent time.





## YEAR 3

Welcome back to the final term of Year 3! This week, children have enjoyed some outdoor learning and activities. They learnt about right angles, obtuse angles and acute angles and then explored outside to find them naturally in the environment. In science, the children have been learning about the eight phases of the moon.



## YEAR 4

This week has seen the start of the maths module on Shapes. Year 4 have been finding out the names of angles and triangles, learning how to differentiate between the different types. They have worked very well and picked it up quickly. In science, we went on an Energy Hunt, where we walked around the primary building and grounds to identify different energy sources and the types of energy they produce.

This week, we have also seen an eagerness to continue with Reading Buddies in Year 1! There have been some very happy readers returning to the classroom.

## YEAR 5

Year 5 have begun many new topics this week. In Science we have begun our learning about mountains, in maths about volume and capacity and in science we have started our learning about plants. Year 5 have especially enjoyed taking their maths learning into the real world by calculating the volume of our classroom in cubic centimetres.



## YEAR 6

Year 6 started their new science topic of Electricity and Light this week. They looked at different forms of electricity including fossil fuels and renewable energy. The children then explored different circuits and tested methods to see if they could get the bulb or buzzer to turn on.
