Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we come to the end of the term, I wanted to take a moment to reflect with you on the purpose of the assessments your children have recently completed.

Assessments play an important role in our teaching. They help us identify gaps in knowledge and understanding so we can tailor our lessons and provide targeted support. They offer useful snapshots of what a child knows at a particular point in time. But they do not—and should not—be seen as a full measure of your child's progress.

Many of the most meaningful forms of growth can't be captured in a test. This term, we have seen children build confidence, strengthen friendships, overcome challenges, and show greater empathy and resilience. We've watched them collaborate, take initiative, express themselves with maturity, and support others with kindness. These are not just "soft skills"—they are essential skills for a happy, successful life.

At BISC, we are deeply committed to developing the whole child. Academic progress matters, but so too does social and emotional development, self-awareness, emotional intelligence, and the ability to thrive in a changing world.

So as you look over assessment results, please remember: they are just one part of a much bigger picture. Your child is growing in ways that a score or grade cannot always show—and that growth is every bit as important.

Nursery



Year 5 have been busy working on their assessments all week in which they have done very well to be so patient, calm and mature and taking time to read questions carefully and checking answers thoroughly. Between preparation and assessments we have had a lovely mini session with year 1 where they have exchanged their learning in science with one another, reminding year 5 of how their learning began and to give year 1 an idea of what they will be working towards by comparing our studies of the same topic area in science.

To end their time in Year 6, the children went to Tahiti Surf School on Thursday! They had lots of fun learning to surf, making sandcastles and swimming in the pool. The children explored the beaches and found lots of wildlife including crabs and fish in different rock pools.
