EYFS:

Nursery

This week in Nursery, we read the story of the Rainbow Fish. The children thought of different sea animals and clapped out symbols for each one.

They enjoyed singing counting songs like “Baby Shark” and “Five Little Fishies,” counting groups of sea creatures with toys and pictures. The children painted ocean waves and matched sea animals to feelings such as happy, shy, angry, and calm. They played a game of “Guess the Missing Under the Sea Picture” on the whiteboard, and worked on sea animal number puzzles to develop their problem-solving skills.



Reception

This week in Reception, we have been focusing on the work of a dentist as part of our topic “People Who Help Us in the Community.” The children brought in their toothbrushes and enjoyed showing their friends how they clean their teeth. We talked about healthy foods that help keep our teeth strong and healthy. We also began our preparations for Chinese New Year – the Year of the Horse. The children enjoyed learning about the celebration and made some decorations to help us celebrate together.





YEAR 1



Year 1 had a fantastic time at the Space Exhibition in Marina Mall. Their curiosity about space, our solar system, and how it all came to be was brought to life during the visit, particularly in the planetarium. The 360° immersive experience captivated the students, who continued talking enthusiastically about it throughout the day. Museum staff carefully supported the children in small groups, taking time to explain each artefact and concept in an age-appropriate way. Students were fascinated by a detailed miniature model of an impact crater and were especially excited to touch a real meteorite. Using their scientific knowledge, they described its properties and how it felt to the touch. Back at school, the children wrote recounts of the trip, using sequencing words to describe each part of the day. We were extremely proud of the level of detail they were able to recall. Well done, Year 1!

YEAR 2

In Year 2, we have been working extremely hard and getting our research ready for our speaking and listening presentations, which will take place next week. The children have thoroughly enjoyed using the computers to research their chosen profession and have shown great enthusiasm and independence. In Maths, we have been learning about doubles as well as odd and even numbers, and the children have enjoyed exploring these concepts through practical activities.




In Humanities, we are continuing our learning about how to keep healthy, with a particular focus on healthy teeth. Year 2 have also been working very hard in their phonics groups, and all of the teachers are incredibly proud of their effort and progress.



YEAR 3

This week, year 3 children have been exploring solids, liquids and gases in the environment around them. In maths, they have started to look at how different objects are measured. In English, the children have been journalists and started writing their own newspaper articles. In humanities, the children created their own pyramids! A busy week!



YEAR 4

This week Year 4 have been experimenting with Volcanoes: making volcanic eruptions using bicarbonate of soda, vinegar and washing up liquid. The results were fun, exciting and messy. We got to experience the slow build up of pressure that happens inside a volcano, before it erupts, releasing its lava!
