Dear Parents and Guardians,

As we reach the mid-point of this academic year it feels apposite to reflect on where we have come from and where we are headed. At BISC we aim high. We want our children to benefit from a top quality education through the acquisition of knowledge, the development of skills and critical thinking and the personal development which builds young people who are respectful and compassionate, and who show rigour and excellence.

This week there have been examples of all of these elements of education. Year 3 went to the Dinos Alive at Sela Park and returned to school brimming with enthusiasm and knowledge about dinosaurs. I was lucky enough to teach a Maths lesson in Year 2 in which the children were developing their critical thinking skills through problem solving using physical manipulatives. The children showed a deep understanding of 3-D shapes that was very admirable. I have also seen PSHE lessons in more than one year group in which the personal development of the children came to the forefront of our in-class teaching and learning.

We have had a fine first half to the academic year and I expect much more of the same for the second half as well.

There have been requests from a number of families for us to offer an optional learning challenge for children to complete at home over the holiday if they wish. This holiday's challenge is for all the children to design and make a puzzle of some kind. This could be a jigsaw, crossword, Suduko, 3D puzzle, online puzzle or any other type that inspires and motivates. There will be prizes awarded next term for those puzzles that show rigour and / or excellence!

In the meantime, I wish you and your families a peaceful half-term holiday and I look forward to welcoming the students back on **Monday 23rd February** (when our Ramadan hours timetable will commence - please see below for more details).

Nursery

In Maths, we counted sea creatures, sang counting songs, and practised positional language such as in, on and under. We also learned about the animals in the Chinese Zodiac and built this into our learning, including counting mandarins and putting them on the 'lucky tree'. 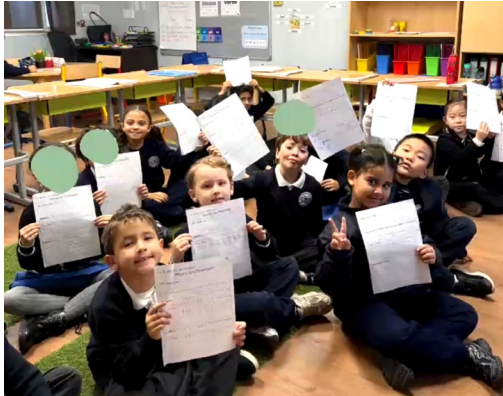
